

My historical research seeks to explain how current ideas, practices, and policies in global health were shaped by historical events and how historical understanding can inform new programs and policies. My first book explores the role of African researchers, subjects, and institutions in the production of global biomedical knowledge by analyzing six decades in the history of virus research in Uganda. My new project explores how public and private entities as well as individuals have engaged in health communication in East Africa and how their strategies reflect their priorities, assumptions, and understandings of health and healing.
